CAMPAIGNERS staged a parade through the streets on Saturday after their victory against a Government decision downgrade Lewisham Hospital.

The celebration was led out by a specially decorated dustcart, symbolising Lewisham support.

Health Secretary Jeremy Hunt's plans to close the hospital's A&E and high-risk maternity services were halted by the High Court in July. But the Government is fighting for the decision

to be overturned so it can press ahead with the plans designed to save a cash-strapped neighbouring health trust.
